### **PE Uniforms for Next Year:**

Next year, students are not required to purchase a PE uniform and may provide clothes for Physical Education themselves. Students, as part of their PE dress code are expected to follow the D303 dress code.

(C.U.S.D. #303 Board Policy #7:160 – Student Appearance) D303 middle school students are expected to change into PE clothing and may not wear clothes that were worn to school.

Dress: • Athletic T-shirt must have sleeves, and follow dress code • Athletic Shorts/Pants Length: Shorts should be no shorter than three inches above the top of the kneecap • Athletic Tennis Shoes: No open toe or open heel.

Students are welcome to wear a past D303 PE uniform that may still be purchased. There will be a limited number available for purchase at the Material Pick Up Days in August. As the weather gets cooler, sweatshirts, sweats, and leggings can be worn to keep warm.



### **A Reminder from the School Nurse:**

State legislation requires that all Illinois children in **Sixth Grade** will have a dental examination. A licensed dentist must perform the examination, and he or she shall sign the form available online at [www.d303.org](http://www.d303.org) under Parents, then "forms" or from your school health office. Each child must present proof of a dental examination by a dentist prior to **May 15, 2016**.

The Illinois Department of Public Health has established a waiver for children who show undue burden or lack of access to a dentist. Parents or legal guardians who object to the dental examinations on religious grounds shall present to the school a signed, detailed statement of the objection.
