Student Electronic Device Expectations

Introduction In order to support the future of our students' learning, a committee convened to review various electronic devices to support student learning. During 2015-16 school year, many teachers were provided with carts of Chromebooks to integrate into their instruction with students. Teachers and students provided positive feedback in their experience with these devices. For the 2017-2018 year, all secondary students will be provided with a Chromebook to be used throughout the school day to support their learning with the option to be able to take them home.

Rationale The devices are cost effective and can be used in numerous ways to augment the established curriculum and instruction. As the district looked at a number of options, the Chromebooks best meet students learning needs.

Cost The value of the device is approximately \$300. If your daughter/son uses proper care, especially while transporting the device, the risk of accidental damage is minimal. Replacement costs will be determined on an as needed basis not to exceed the replacement cost of the device (currently approximately \$300).

Handling, Care, and Transport

- When walking with the device, carry it carefully with the lid closed.
- Cases are encouraged.
- Do not leave the device unattended.
- Do not place the electronic device on the ground.
- Avoid having sharp objects near the device, including pens or pencils.
- When closing the lid, make sure nothing is inside.
- Do not eat or drink or place liquids near your device.
- When picking up, pick up by the base (bottom) with both hands.
- When device is not in use, keep the lid closed.
- The device will come with a district provided Asset Tag sticker and device ID sticker, as well as a sticker with your name.

Student Responsibilities: Although the school district owns the devices and will loan them to the students as a tool to support their learning, in order for this to be successful, students do need to take responsibility for the device loaned to them (just like when checking out books from the LRC, using textbooks, and borrowing classroom supplies). Students are to follow all expectations in the District's Acceptable Use Policy found in the D303 Handbook.

Students will:

- Fully charge their device at home each evening.
- Use their district provided Google Account for email and document sharing.
- Assume responsibility for all activity on their account(s).
- Log off and secure their device after they finish working to protect the device and their information.
- Notify a staff member or administration if an inappropriate or threatening email or message is received.

Student Activities Prohibited, including, but not limited, to the following:

- Gaining access to other students' accounts, files, and/or data, including sharing of passwords.
- Any action that violates existing Board policy or public law such as credit card fraud, electronic forgery, or other forms of illegal behavior.
- Videotaping or photographing any individual, teacher, or student without their consent.
- Using any wireless communications device in any bathroom, locker room, or any other unauthorized area.
- Sending, accessing, uploading, downloading, or distributing offensive, profane, threatening, pornographic, obscene, or sexually explicit materials.
- Transmitting or accessing materials that are obscene, offensive, threatening or otherwise intended to harass or demean others.
- Illegal installation or transmission of copyrighted materials. Use of sites selling or sharing research papers.
- Changing of device settings beyond basic controls.

- Spamming or sending mass or inappropriate emails.
- Use of the school's Google accounts for financial or commercial gain or for any illegal activity.
- Use of anonymous accounts or impersonating others online.
- Students are not allowed to give out personal information over the Internet unless authorized by a classroom teacher. This includes, but is not limited to, setting up internet accounts including those necessary for social media, eBay, email, etc.
- Adding stickers, except those given by or authorized by teachers.
- Vandalism (any malicious attempt to harm or destroy hardware, software or data, including, but not limited to, the uploading or creation of computer viruses or programs that can infiltrate computer systems and/or damage software components) of school equipment.
- Adding inappropriate wallpaper images that include things such as weapons, violence, sexuality, alcohol or drugs.
- Unauthorized Internet/Computer Games during instruction.
- Bypassing the web filter.
- Lending Chromebook for other individuals to use.

Violations may result in disciplinary action including the loss of chromebook privileges, suspension and/or expulsion of students. When applicable, law enforcement agencies may be involved.

Damage, Loss or Theft- Repair and Replacement Costs:

If misfortune occurs while your student has the Chromebook off of school grounds, please notify the school by leaving a voice message at the school office of your child's school or send an email to your child's principal. In addition, in the case of suspected theft, please immediately contact local law enforcement to file a police report. Please share a copy of the police report with your school (either via email or in person) in order for the school district to assist the police in discovering the stolen device.

Web 2.0 Resources and Student Online Accounts

In our commitment to provide the best learning experience for your student, D303 continues to search for relevant instructional tools that meet the needs of 21st Century learners. Over time, we have located websites and mobile apps which provide students with tools that allow them to work and collaborate in new ways. These sites fall into a category broadly defined as *Web 2.0 Resources*. These online programs, are usually free or inexpensive and are a way digital information is created, shared, stored, distributed, and managed. A registered account, requiring personal student information (such as their name or their D303 Google credentials), is needed in order for these projects to be saved online for future editing and easy remote access.

In keeping with Internet Safety Protocol, parent(s) and/or guardian(s) must grant permission for their student to sign-up for any account which requires a student to enter personal information online. If permission is not granted, then the student will complete an alternate assignment. Students using an approved Web 2.0 site as part of their classroom learning will be expected to follow established classroom and school expectations for acceptable use and behavior.

The Web 2.0 Resources site will be updated throughout the year as teachers find new resources and request district approval. After this form is signed and returned, teachers will provide an email notification if a new tool is approved to use in their classroom.
